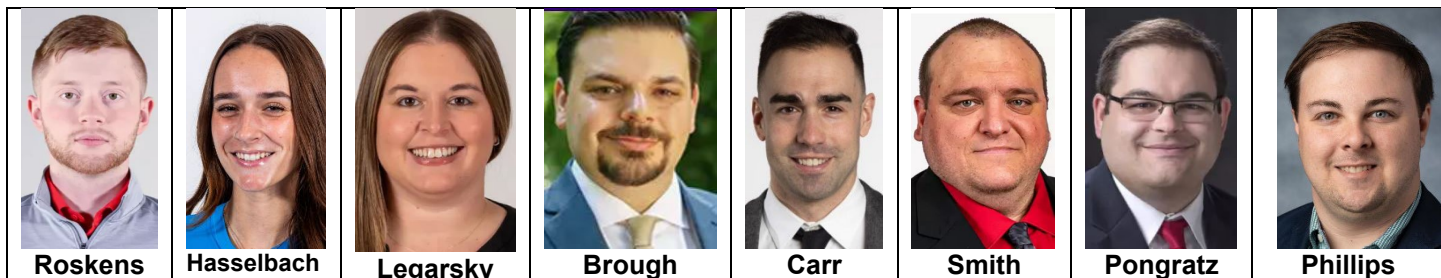

2024 Myrtle Beach Invitational Notes

- **Bradley** has posted nine 20-plus win seasons this century, with current coach Brian Wardle responsible for five of those teams for the 2017-2018, 2018-2019, 2019-2020, 2022-2023, and 2023-2024 seasons. Wardle led the Braves to back-to-back Missouri Valley post-season titles in 2019 and 2020.
- **Middle Tennessee** has advanced to the semi-finals in the last three Conference USA post-season tournaments, where the Blue Raiders have lost to eventual champions UAB, Florida Atlantic, and Western Kentucky. Middle Tennessee will appear in its second Myrtle Beach Invitational after placing seventh in 2019.
- **Ohio** has posted a 98-60 record the past five seasons under coach Jeff Boals as the Bobcats have advanced to the post-season twice with an NCAA appearance in 2021 after winning the Mid-American title. Ohio placed seventh in the 2019 Myrtle Beach Invitational by defeating Middle Tennessee 75-63.
- **Portland** advanced to the second round of the West Coast post-season before being eliminated by San Francisco. The Pilots won their previous two games before the Don setback by defeating Santa Clara in the regular-season finale and Loyola Marymount in the first round of the postseason.
- **Princeton** captured the 2024 Ivy League regular-season crown and has competed in the post-season the past three campaigns, highlighted by an NCAA "Sweet 16" appearance where the Tigers eliminated Arizona and Missouri before losing to Creighton in the regionals.
- **USF** set a school record for wins in a season as first-season coach Amir Abdur-Rahim led the Bulls to a 25-8 record and the American Athletic Conference regular-season title. USF advanced to the second round of the NIT with a first-round win over in-state rival UCF.
- **Texas State** is coached by Terrence Johnson, who, in four seasons, has guided the Bobcats to 72 wins, two Sun Belt regular-season titles, and a 2022 NIT berth. Texas State finished the 2023-2024 campaign by winning six of its last seven games, with the setback being in the Sun Belt post-season semi-finals, where the Bobcats dropped a 73-68 decision to eventual champions James Madison.
- **Wright State** finished the season with an 18-14 record as coach Scott Nagy left for Southern Illinois and associate head coach Clint Sargent took over the program leaders. Despite losing in the quarterfinals of the Horizon post-season tourney, The Raiders rebounded from a 6-8 start to win 12 of their last 18 games, highlighted by a 21-point win (96-75) over conference champions Oakland.

The **HTC Center** is hosting an ESPN Events in-season tournament for the sixth straight season, starting with the **2017 Puerto Rico Tip-Off** that was relocated to Coastal Carolina University due to Hurricane Maria. The inaugural **Myrtle Beach Invitational** was staged in 2018 at the **HTC Center**. Opened in August 2012, the \$35-million **HTC Center** provides more than 131,000 square feet of space, the home of Chanticleer men's and women's basketball and volleyball. It serves as the university's student recreation center. The HTC Center accommodates more than 3,200 fans for athletic events and is equipped with state-of-the-art technology, including a Daktronics video board system. The **HTC Center** has also staged the Big South Men's and Women's Basketball Championships (2013-2016) and the 2016 Atlantic Coast Conference Women's Basketball Championship. The groundbreaking for the facility was held April 15, 2010. Both the men's and women's programs opened the facility with victories. The men defeated the Akron 74-70 in an overtime thriller on November 9, 2012. The women's program followed by a 58-39 victory against North Carolina Central on November 12, 2012.



ESPN Events, a division of ESPN, owns and operates a nationwide portfolio of collegiate sporting events. In 2023, the 32-event schedule included four early-season college football kickoff games, 17 college bowl games, 10 college basketball events, a college softball event, and a new college gymnastics event coming in 2024. 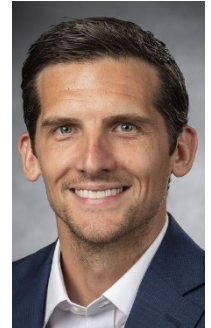
